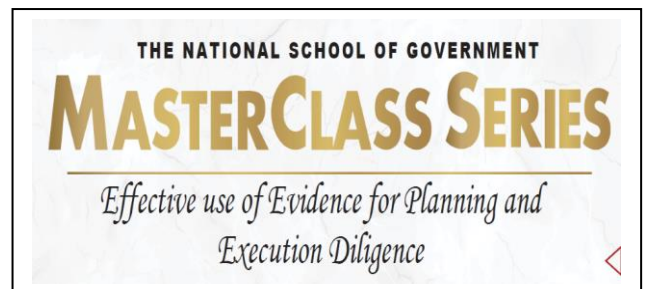

ENGAGEMENT WITH ESWATINI CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION

In an effort to strengthen ties with regional and continental counterparts, on Friday, 05 April 2024, the Public Service Commission under the stewardship of the Chairperson, Professor Somadoda Fikeni met with the Chairperson of the Civil Service Commission (CSC) of Eswatini, Mr Simanga Mamba, at the Offices of the Auditor-General in Lynnwood. Mr Simanga was accompanied by Mr Richard Phungwayo from the Ministry of Public Service in Eswatini.



The purpose of the meeting was to forge partnerships with the Eswatini Civil Service Commission. The delegation was briefed about the work of the South African Public Service Commission, including the Budget. Commissioners Nancy Ngwenya and Errol Magerman, Director-General, Advocate Dinkie Dube and Mr Lizo Yekwa were part of the PSC delegation that attended the meeting.



Following the meeting, it was agreed that further meetings and workshops will be arranged with the view to exhaust issues of interest and development.

The Eswatini Civil Service Commission is established under Section 186 of the Constitution of Eswatini. This section together with Section 187 stipulates the function of the Commission, i.e. Appointments, Acting Appointments, Confirmations, Secondments, Promotions, Transfers, Discipline, Dismissals, and Termination of appointments. The values of the CSC are Integrity; Honesty; Fairness; Equity; Responsiveness; Excellence; Empathy; and Respect for professionalism.
